Inclusive Education



All children have the right to the education regardless of their disability, gender, race, and nationality. To achieve universalization of education inclusive education is one of the most innovative approaches to educating the children with disability and learning difficulties with normal children under the same roof. It brings all students together in one classroom and community, regardless their weaknesses or strengths in any are, and seeks to maximize the potential of all students.

Inclusive education defined as a learning environment that promotes the full personal, academic and professional development of all learners irrespective of their race, class, gender, disability, religion, culture, sexual preference, learning style and language. Inclusive education means that all students in a school community regardless their strength or weakness in any area, become part of the school community. It is the process of addressing and responding to the diverse needs of all learners by increasing participation in learning and reducing exclusion within and from education.

The Right to Education Act 2009 is a historic and welcomed step in our country. This Act ensures the good future of elementary education. RTE has come into force from 1 April 2010 but its implementation in school is still questionable. Inclusive Education is an important part of RTE Act. it covers children from migrated population, tribal groups, children from labor class, children with various types of disabilities such as physical, learning, social, economical, cultural etc. and also the children who are coming in school for the first time and are being enrolled in age appropriate classrooms. Inclusive education is about the full participation and achievement of all learners. In fully inclusive schools, children and young people with special education needs are engaged and achieving through being present, participating and learning.

The concept of inclusion is based on the idea that students with disabilities should not be segregated but should be included in a classroom with their typically developing peers.

Inclusion does not mean putting children with special needs into the regular classroom. We have to accept their diversity, respect their individuality, create opportunities for their participation in all activities of the school, and provide support to both children and teachers so that children can realize their full potential and teachers will be able to improve their performances. It is the acceptance of all pupils in the mainstream system, taught with a common framework, and identified as the responsibility of all teachers.


